

The 2021-2022 Budget Provides Funds for:

\$159,800 <u>Technology</u>: Desktops for offices & Labs, Chromebooks monitoring, zoom videos, FM System, replace intercoms, continue replacing existing access points, and other contingencies for repairs/replace technology.

\$185,000 Security: 4 Class III officers, extended school year security, after school security guard.

\$344,909 Personnel: 2-Elementary Teachers(RV 4th Grade & LV 5th Grade); 2 PT-special Education Teachers; 3-P/T Aides; G&T Teacher; ABA program.

\$100,000 Summer School Program - Increase for summer 2021

\$245,430 Mental Health & Other: Continue with St. Clare's Clinical Service Program and the Uncommon Thread Behavioral Health Program.

S229,200 <u>Curriculum & Other</u>: Diversity, Inclusion, & Equity books; library books; E-books; non-fiction books; replacement of workbooks; & other misc. curriculum replacement books and materials.

\$3,128,718 Facilities and Transportation: LV roof replacement; RV HVAC replacement & Electrical upgrade; Security Grant -911 inform; Demography Study; Repair interior doors, Outsource a total of 3 transportation routes.

- The budget accounts for a 0.51% increase in tax levy.
- This budget reflects a flat increase in State Aid (pending gubernatorial budget message).
- The district continues to empower our students to excel by following the 5-year Strategic Plan implemented in the 2017/18 school year, our plan is set to be completed in June 2022 at which time we will create a new five-year plan.
- · The administration continues working to bring in new revenue
 - · Rental income
 - Tuition income
 - · Grant applications
 - · Advertisement income

The District is Debt Free and continues improving the facilities utilizing capital and maintenance reserve.
